(3) Cost effective and practical methods by which to educate the general public and incoming visitors on the common causes, symptoms, and preventative methods of chikungunya virus;

(4) Specific strategies to coordinate state and Vector Control Unit actions to undertake comprehensive surveillance, inspection, and treatment of individuals infected by a mosquito borne virus and properties identified as sites commonly inhabited by live breeding mosquitoes; and

(5) Practical and cost effective emergency policies that would guide state administration of health care services statewide, with particular focus on providing health care services promptly to communities located in rural areas, following an outbreak of chikungunya virus; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chikungunya Virus Advisory Committee consist of the following members:

(1) 1 representative of the Vector Control Unit;

(2) 1 representative of the Sanitation Branch of the Department of Health;

(3) 1 representative of the Department of Health;

(A) Water security, food safety, and vector borne infectious diseases;
(B) Respiratory and pulmonary effects, including responses to air allergens;

(D) The health effects of air pollution, including heightened sensitivity to air pollution; and
(E) Mental and behavioral health impacts of climate change in the health of displaced

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persons and at risk populations and communities;

(2) Creating evidence based tools for predicting and monitoring the public health impacts of climate change at the state and community levels;

(3) Identifying and prioritizing communities and populations vulnerable to the health effects of climate change, and determining actions and communication strategies that should be adopted to inform and protect these communities and populations;

(4) Developing recommendations for health communication, public education, and outreach programs aimed at public health and health care professionals as well as the general public to promote preparedness and response strategies related to climate change and public health;

(5) Developing recommendations for expanding and training the public health workforce to strengthen its capacity to respond to and prepare for the health impacts of climate change; and

(6) Developing recommendations for the development, implementation, and support of preparedness and response planning to anticipate and reduce the health threats due to climate change; and

(5) Committee on Energy and Environment. The purview of this committee includes those programs relating to energy resources, including the development of alternative energy resources; population; and environmental quality control and protection, including litter control, recycling, wastewater treatment, endangered species, invasive species and hazardous waste.

(6) Committee on Government Operations. The purview of this committee includes those programs relating to state government operations policy, including government efficiency[;], procurement[;], and state facilities unless the policy, state facility, or department is within the purview of another Committee pursuant to this Rule.

(7) Committee on Hawaiian Affairs. The purview of this committee includes those programs relating to Hawaiian affairs, including but not limited to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, Hawaiian home lands, sovereignty, and burial councils.

(8) Committee on Health. The purview of this committee includes those programs relating to general health, maternal and child health, communicable diseases, dental health, medical and hospital services, mental health, developmental disabilities, and hospitals.

(9) Committee on Higher Education and the Arts. The purview of this committee includes those programs relating to the University of Hawaii, the community college system, private higher education bond financing, and other education matters relevant to higher education, but excluding the Hawaii P-20 Initiative; and culture and the arts in the State, including but not limited to programs relating to historic preservation.

(10) Committee on Human Services and Housing. The purview of this committee includes those programs relating to public assistance; Medquest; youth services; early childhood learning and care programs under the Department of Human Services; vocational rehabilitation; long term care; programs relating to the promotion of the general well-being of Hawaii's youth, families, elderly population, and the homeless; affordable and public housing; urban renewal; community development; and housing development.

(11) Committee on Judiciary and Labor.
